The Catskill Conservation Corps **invites volunteers to pick up litter at Blue Hole, the Peekamoose trailhead and Sundown Primitive Camping area** on Sunday, July 5 from 1pm to 3pm. Sleep in after the fireworks, enjoy a leisurely brunch in town, and then come on out and lend a hand! Volunteers will be working with Catskill Conservation Corps (CCC) staff to remove litter from the roadside, trail, campsites, and vicinity. When we're finished, enjoy a swim in Blue Hole - easily one of the most beautiful and remote swimming holes in the Catskills!

Volunteers should be sure to wear comfortable shoes and clothes that you don't mind getting a bit dirty. Dress appropriately for the outdoor conditions and our activities; pack plenty of water and snacks; and bring work gloves if you have them. CCC staff will also provide some light refreshments and we will have some extra work gloves available.
